Additional Recommendations

- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 80" x 98" (2.03m x 2.49m) batting

Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric

Fabrics A, B, D, E, H-L, and N-R, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; subcut
- (5) 6½" squares

Fabrics C, F, and G, cut:

- (2) 6½" x WOF; subcut
- (10) 6½" squares

Fabric M, cut:

- (16) 3⅞" x WOF; subcut
- (160) 3⅞" squares

Fabric S, cut:

- (8) 7¼" x WOF; subcut
- (40) 7¼" squares
- (10) 2½" x WOF for binding

Instructions

Use a ¼" (.64cm) seam allowance throughout. Handle triangles carefully so as not to stretch bias edges. Sew all pieces with right sides together and raw edges aligned. Press after each seam towards darker fabric unless directed otherwise.

Block Assembly

1. Cut all **Fabric M** 3⅞" squares in half diagonally. **Fig. 1**

2. Cut all **Fabric S** 7¼" squares in half diagonally twice. **Fig. 2**

3. Stitch 2 **Fabric M** 3⅞" triangles to both short edges of a **Fabric S** 7¼" triangle. Make a total of 160 Unit 1 (3½" x 6½" including seam allowances). **Fig. 3**

4. Sew 2 Unit 1 together as shown. Make a total of 80 Unit 2; **Fig. 4**

5. Arrange 5 **Fabric A** 6½" squares with 4 Unit 2 in 3 rows of 3. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together to complete a block. Use the remaining 6½" squares to make a total of 20 blocks (18½" square including seam allowances). **Fig. 5**

Quilt Top Assembly

6. Noting the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 5), arrange the blocks into 5 horizontal rows of 4 blocks each.
7. Sew blocks into rows, pressing seam allowances in each row in the same direction, and alternating direction from row to row.
8. Sew the rows together to complete the quilt top.

Finishing

9. Sew together the 2½" **Fabric S** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
10. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
11. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.

12. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
