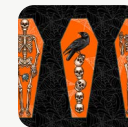

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- 100% cotton thread
- 71" x 64" (1.80 m x 1.63 m) batting

CUTTING

Notes:

- Due to the nature of the fussy-cut **Fabric D** panel, we advise not prewashing any fabrics for this project to avoid shrinkage that would alter the necessary cut sizes.
- If you like to make your Half-Square Triangles (HST) and Flying Geese units oversized and trim them down to size, you may wish to increase the cut sizes for these units from what is listed.

WOF = Width of Fabric

From Fabric A, cut:

- (11) $1\frac{5}{8}"$ x WOF; subcut
 - (4) $1\frac{5}{8}"$ x $35\frac{3}{4}"$
 - (8) $1\frac{5}{8}"$ x $5\frac{1}{8}"$

From Fabric B, fussy cut:

- (4) $5\frac{1}{8}"$ x $5\frac{1}{8}"$, (2) from each type of skull motif

Fabric B Cutting Diagram

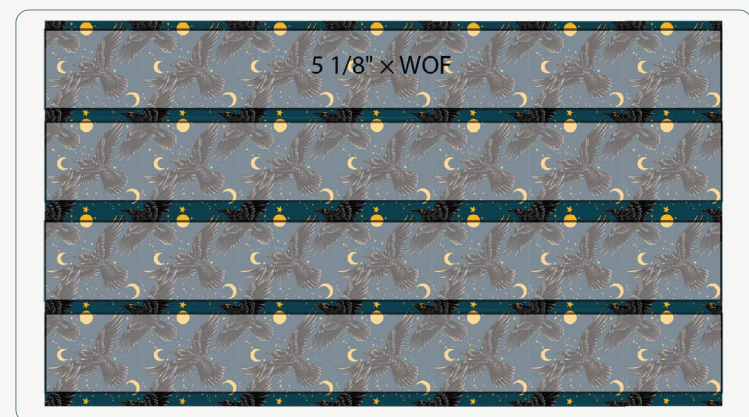


From Fabric C, fussy cut:

- (4) $5\frac{1}{8}"$ x WOF, centered horizontally on the ravens; subcut
 - (2) $5\frac{1}{8}"$ x $42\frac{3}{4}"$
 - (2) $5\frac{1}{8}"$ x $35\frac{3}{4}"$

Note: If usable WOF is less than $42\frac{3}{4}"$, cut an additional $5\frac{1}{8}"$ strip and piece the strips as needed. Fabric C yardage allows for this additional strip.

CUTTING

From Fabric D, fussy cut:

(1) 42 $\frac{3}{4}$ " wide x 35 $\frac{3}{4}$ " high rectangle, centered on the coffins

From Fabric E, cut:

- (3) 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF; subcut
- (26) 4" x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles for Flying Geese units
- (1) 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF; subcut
- (4) 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " for HST units

From Fabric F, cut:

(7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for binding

From Fabric G, cut:

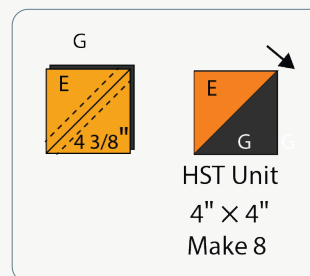
- (1) 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x WOF; subcut
- (4) 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " for HST units
- (6) 4" x WOF; subcut
- (56) 4" x 4" (52 for Flying Geese units and 4 for border corner squares)

INSTRUCTIONS

All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press after each seam in the direction of the arrows.

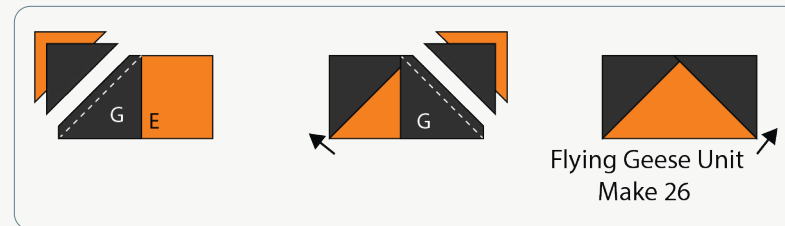
- 1** Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the **Fabric E** 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " squares. Place each marked square on top of a **Fabric G** 4 $\frac{3}{8}$ " square and sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the center line. Cut apart on the line, press towards the darker fabric, and trim to square up, keeping the diagonal seam centered in the corners, to 4" x 4". Make a total of 8 HST Units (**Fig. 1**).

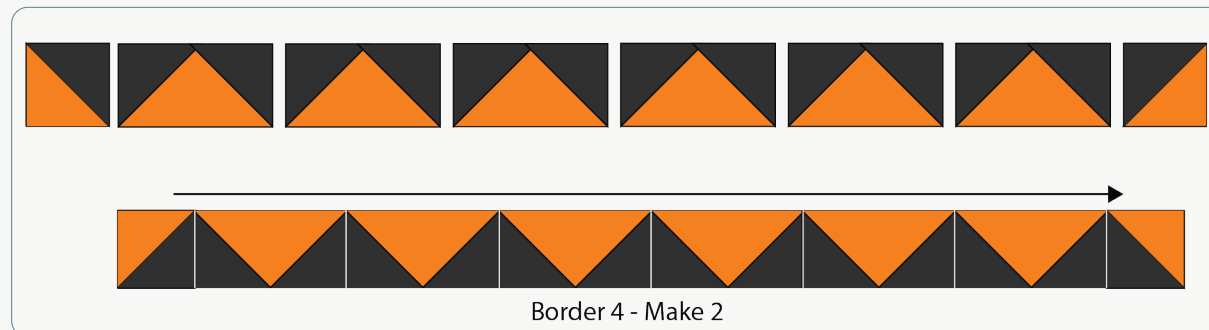
- 2** Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all but 4 of the **Fabric G** 4" squares. Place a marked square on the left-hand side of a **Fabric E** 4" x 7½" rectangle, with the line oriented from the bottom left to upper right. Sew on the line, trim the upper corner to a ¼" seam allowance, and press towards the darker fabric. Repeat with a second marked square on the opposite end of the rectangle. If needed, trim to square up to 4" x 7½". Repeat to make a total of 26 Flying Geese Units (**Fig. 2**).

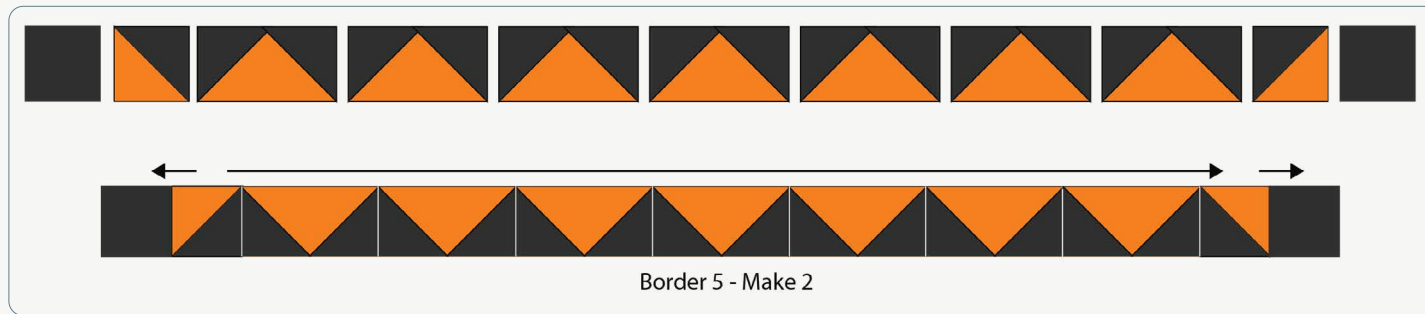
- 3** Arrange 2 HST Units and 6 Flying Geese Units in a row with the fabrics oriented as shown. Sew together into a row to make Border 4 (49½" long). Make (2) (**Fig. 3**).

- 4** Arrange 2 **Fabric G** 4" squares, 2 HST Units, and 7 Flying Geese Units in a row with the fabrics oriented as shown. Sew together into a row to make Border 5 (63½" long). Make (2) (**Fig. 4**).

- 5** Sew a **Fabric A** 1½" x 35¾" strip to the top and bottom of a **Fabric C** 5½" x 35¾" strip, noting orientation of the raven motifs, to make Border 1. Make (2) (**Fig. 5**).

- 6 Arrange (1) of each **Fabric B** fussy-cut square, (4) **Fabric A** $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x $5\frac{1}{8}$ " strips, and (1) **Fabric C** $5\frac{1}{8}$ " x $42\frac{3}{4}$ " strip, in a row as shown, making sure all fussy-cut motifs are oriented right reading. Sew together. Using the remaining **Fabric A** $1\frac{5}{8}$ " strip lengths, including usable leftover lengths from the previous subcuts, sew pieces together end to end as needed and cut (4) $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Sew a **Fabric A** $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the top and bottom to make Border 2. Repeat, switching the position of the **Fabric B** motifs, to make Border 3 (**Fig. 6**).

QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY

Note: Follow the **Quilt Layout** diagram (page 9) while assembling the quilt.

- 7** Pin, matching ends and centers, then sew a Border 1 to the left and right sides of the **Fabric D** $42\frac{3}{4}$ " x $35\frac{3}{4}$ " rectangle, noting orientation of the raven motifs in the borders. Press towards the border.
- 8** Repeat Step 7 to add Border 2 to the top and Border 3 to the bottom of the quilt center, so that the fussy-cut skulls are right-reading.
- 9** Repeat Step 7 to add Border 4 to the left and right sides of the quilt center, noting fabric orientation. Press towards the inner border.
- 10** Repeat Step 9 to add Border 5 to the top and bottom of the quilt center to complete the quilt.

FINISHING

- 11** Sew together the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric F** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- 12** Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
- 13** Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- 14** Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
