- $100 \%$ cotton thread in colors to match
- 64 " $\times 65$ " $(163 \mathrm{~cm} \times 165 \mathrm{~cm})$ batting


## Color Bars Quilt

Cutting:
WOF = Width of Fabric
To cut all the listed pieces from the one strip, cut the largest piece first then divide the remaining strip into $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ - wide strips to cut the small squares.

## Cutting Diagram

$2^{11 / 2 " 1} \times 2^{11 / 2 "}$

## Fabrics A and B, cut from each:

(1) $6^{1} / 2$ " $\times$ WOF; sub-cut
(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 30^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle and (6) $2^{1 / 2 "}$ squares

## Fabrics C, D and E, cut from each:

(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 30^{1 / 2 "}$ " rectangle and (5) $2^{1 / 2 "}$ squares

## Fabrics F, G and H, cut from each:

(1) $61 / 2 " \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 30^{1 / 2 "}$ rectangle and (4) $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares

## Fabrics I and J, cut from each:

(1) $6^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 13^{1} / 2 "$ rectangle and (5) $2^{11 / 2 " ~ s q u a r e s ~}$

## Fabrics K, L, M and N, cut from each:

(1) $61 / 2 " \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 13^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle and (4) $2^{11 / 2 "}$ squares

## Fabric $\mathbf{O}$, cut:

(1) $6^{11 / 2 " ~} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 13^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle and (3) $2^{1 / 2 "}$ squares

## Fabric P, cut:

(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(1) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 13^{1} / 22^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle and (4) $2^{11 / 2 "}$ squares
(6) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for Borders
(7) $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for Binding

## Instructions

All seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press seam allowances following the arrows in the diagrams.

1. Lay out (1) $2^{1} / 2$ " square of Fabrics $\mathbf{A}, \mathbf{B}, \mathbf{D}, \mathbf{E}$, $\mathbf{G}, \mathbf{I}, \mathbf{K}, \mathbf{L}$ and $\mathbf{P}$, in three rows of three squares as shown. (Fig. 1) Sew the squares into rows. Sew the rows together to complete Nine Patch 1 ( $6^{1 / 2 "}$ square).

2. Repeat the process in step 1 to make Nine Patch 2 through 8 in the fabric combinations shown in Fig. 2.

## Quilt Top Assembly

Note: Follow the Quilt Layout diagram on page 5 for placement while assembling the quilt top. Measure the quilt center before cutting border pieces and adjust measurements given if necessary.
3. Sew the (8) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 30^{1 / 2 "}$ rectangles together, along the long edges, in the order: Fabric F, C, G, H, A, B, D and E, to make Row 1 ( $30^{1} 1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 48^{1 / 2 "}$ ).
4. Sew the (8) Nine Patch blocks together in numerical order, to make Row $2\left(6^{1 / 21 "} \times 48^{1 / 2 "}\right)$.
5. Sew the (8) $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 13^{1 / 2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles together, along the long edges, in the order: Fabric O, P, I, N, K, J, M and L, to make Row 3 ( $13^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 48^{1 / 22^{\prime \prime}}$ ).
6. Sew the Rows together to complete the Quilt Center ( $48^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 49^{1 / 2}$ "). Press seam allowances away from Row 2.
7. Sew together (3) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric P Border strips, end to end into a long strip. Cut (2) $4^{1} / 21 \times 48^{1 / 2 "}$ border strips. Sew to the top and bottom edges of the Quilt Center ( $48^{1 / 2 "} \times 57^{\prime \prime} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ). Press seam allowances towards the borders.
8. Sew together (3) $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{P}$ Border strips, end to end. Cut (2) $4^{1 / 2 "} \times 57^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ border strips. Sew to the side edges of the Quilt Center to complete the Quilt Top ( $56^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 57^{1 / 2 "}$ ). Press seam allowances towards the borders.

## Finishing

9. Sew together the $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{P}$ binding strips end to end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
10. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
11. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12 from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
12. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
