

Additional Recommendations

- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 90" x 100" (2.3cm x 2.54m) batting

Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric Fat quarter: 18" x 21"

WOFQ = Width of Fat Quarter (usually the longer

side)

From Fabrics A, B, G, I, K, and L, cut from each:

(1) $10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " square

(4) 6" x 6" squares

From Fabric D, cut:

(9) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for outer border

(1) 6" x WOF; cut (2) 6" x 6" squares; trim strip to $5\frac{1}{2}$ " and cut (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle

(10) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for straight-grain binding or enough $2\frac{1}{2}$ "- wide bias strips to make 365" of bias binding

From Fabrics C, E, F, H, J, M, O, P, and Q, cut from each:

(3) 6" x 6" squares

(3) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From Fabric N, cut:

(8) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for inner border

(1) 6" x WOF; subcut

(3) 6" x 6" squares; trim strip to $5\frac{1}{2}$ " and cut

(3) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

From Fabric R, cut:

(10) 6" x WOF; subcut (56) 6" squares

(8) 5½" x WOF; subcut (56) 5½" x 5½" squares

Instructions

All seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together.

As flannel is thicker than quilting cotton, you may wish to test your seam allowance with a flannel scrap before piecing all your blocks to make sure they come out to the correct finished size. The HST units are designed to be cut oversized and trimmed down to size after piecing.

Press seam allowances open unless otherwise stated.


- 1. Pair each **Fabric A-Q** 6" square right sides together with a **Fabric R** 6" square. Cut once diagonally from corner to corner. Keep paired triangles together as they are cut.
- 2. Sew paired triangles together along the long (bias) edge, handling bias edges carefully so as not to distort. Press open. Trim to square up to $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ ", making sure to keep the diagonal seam through the trimmed corners, to make 112 HST Units. (**Fig. 1**)



3. Sew (8) Fabric A HST Units, (1) Fabric A 10½" x 10½" square, and (4) Fabric R 5½" x 5½ squares together as shown to make a Star Block (20½" x 20½"). Repeat with Fabrics B, G, I, K, and L to make (6) total. (Fig. 2)



4. Sew (4) **Fabric D** HST Units, (1) **Fabric D** $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, and (2) **Fabric R** $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " squares together as shown into a Half Star Block ($10\frac{1}{2}$ " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ "). (**Fig. 3**)



5. Sew (2) Fabric C HST Units and (1) each Fabric C and Fabric R 5½" x 5½" squares together to make a Quarter Star Block (10½" x 10½"). Repeat with all remaining HST Units and matching 5½" x 5½" squares to make (3) Quarter Star Blocks each of Fabrics C, E, F, H, J, M, N, O, P, and Q (30 total). (Fig. 4)

Quilt Top Assembly

Note: Follow the **Quilt Layout** diagram on page 5 while assembling the quilt. Measure the Quilt Center width and height before cutting and adding borders. Adjust border measurements where necessary to match your measurements.

- **6.** Sew the Stars, Half Star, and Quarter Star Blocks together into large sections as shown. Sew the large sections together into the quilt top.
- 7. Sew the **Fabric N** 2½" x WOF strips together end-to-end. Cut (2) side borders 80½"- long and (2) top/bottom borders 74½"- long. Sew the side borders to the left and right sides of the quilt center, press, then sew the remaining strips to the top and bottom. Press.
- **8.** Repeat Step 7 using the **Fabric D** $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips, adding (2) side borders $84\frac{1}{2}$ " long and (2) top/bottom borders $82\frac{1}{2}$ " long to the quilt top. Press.

Finishing

- **9.** Sew together the 2½" **Fabric D** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- **10.** Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.

- 11. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to ½" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- **12.** Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
