- 70 " $\times 70$ " ( $1.78 \mathrm{~m} \times 1.78 \mathrm{~m}$ ) batting
- Template plastic
- $11 / 2$ yards paper-backed fusible web
- Optional: $1^{1 / 2}$ yards tear-away stabilizer

## Preparation

1. Print the template patterns (pages 11-14) at $100 \%$ /actual size and measure to confirm correct size. Trace one each of following shapes onto template plastic and cut out on the outer solid lines:

Triangle, Small and Large Kites, and Small and Large Left and Right Corners (7 total)
2. If desired, you can also make tracing templates of the Melon and Large and Small Quarter-Circle template patterns. Use a light box or other light source to trace the following quantities onto the paper side of the fusible web in the quantities listed below, leaving about $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ between tracings:

> Melon Templates - trace 4 times
> Large Quarter - Circle Template - trace 8 times

Small Quarter - Circle Template - trace 48 times
3. Cut the tracings apart with approximately $1 / 4$ " around each tracing.

## Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric

## Fabric A, cut:

(2) 25 " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(2) $25^{\prime \prime}$ squares and (1) $14^{1 / 2}$ " square

NOTE: The final look of your quilt may vary depending on the cut of your fabric.

## Fabric C, cut:

(1) $7^{1 / 4 " 1} \times$ WOF; subcut
(2) $7 \frac{1}{4}$ " squares

4 Large Kites (noting orientation of print)

Fabric E, cut:
(7) $2^{11 / 2 " ~} \times$ WOF binding strips

4 Triangles
8 Small Kites (noting orientation of stripe)

## Fabric F, cut:

(1) 6 " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $6 "$ squares
(2) $5^{1 / 8 "}$ squares
(7) 4 " $\times$ WOF for outer border

## Fabric H, cut:

(1) $7^{1 ⁄ 2}$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares
(1) $7^{11 / 4} \times$ WOF, subcut
(2) $7 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(1) $6^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; subcut
(4) $6 "$ squares
(4) $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares
(1) $5^{1 / 2}$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(8) $5^{1 / 2 "}$ squares (you may need to cut from the remainder of a larger strip)
(6) $4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for inner border
(3) $25 / 8$ " $\times$ WOF; subcut
(44) $25 / 8^{\text {" }}$ squares

8 each Large Left and Right Corners
8 each Small Left and Right Corners
Note: Arrange the following tracings, fusible side down on the wrong side of the indicated fabrics, fuse in place following manufacturer's guidelines, then cut out on the drawn lines.

Fabric B, fuse and cut:
8 large quarter-circles

## Fabric E , fuse and cut:

16 small quarter-circles (noting orientation of stripe)

## Fabric F, fuse and cut:

12 small quarter-circles
Fabric G, fuse and cut:
4 melons
20 small quarter-circles

## Instructions

Note: Use a $1 / 4$ " $(.64 \mathrm{~cm})$ seam allowance throughout. Sew all pieces with right sides together and raw edges even using matching thread. Press as directed after each seam.

## Block Construction

1. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner of each $7^{1 ⁄ 2} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H square. With marked side up and noting orientation, place marked H squares on 2 opposite corners of the $14^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric $\mathbf{A}$ squares. Sew along the marked lines, trim the seam allowance to $1 / 41$ ", and press corners open. Repeat on the remaining 2 corners as shown to complete the Center Unit. Fig. 1

2. Arrange the prepared Fabric G melon appliqués on the Center Unit as shown, making sure the melons do not cover the $1 / 4$ " seam allowance at the outer edges of the unit. Following manufacturer's instructions, fuse the melons to the unit. If desired, back with tear-away stabilizer (optional). Using a matching thread, machine-stitch around raw edges of melons to secure, using a zigzag, satin, or blanket stitch. Remove stabilizer if used. Center Block measures $14^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square (unfinished). Fig. 2

Center Block - Make 1
3. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on each 6" Fabric H square. If desired, mark 2 additional lines each $1 / 4$ " away from the first (center line). Fig. 3

4. With marked side up, align a marked H square with a 6" Fabric F square, aligning all edges. Stitch along the 2 outside lines (or $1 / 4$ " from center line if you only marked one line). Cut apart on the center line. Press each unit open. Centering seam, trim each to $5^{1 / 2 "}$ square, including seam allowances. Repeat to make a total of 8 of Unit 1. Fig. 4

5. Sew 1 each Fabric H Large Left and Right Corners to long sides of a Fabric D Large Kite. Make a total of 4 of Unit 2 ( $5^{1 / 2 "}$ square unfinished). Fig. 5

6. Sew 1 each Fabric H Large Left and Right Corner to the long sides of a Fabric E Triangle. Repeat to make a total of 2 each Units 3a and 3b, noting orientation of Fabric $\mathbf{E}\left(4^{1 / 21} \times 5^{1 / 2 "}\right.$ unfinished). Fig. 6

7. Arrange 2 of Unit 1 and 1 Unit 3b along the sides of the Center Block. Sew units into side borders, then sew to right and left sides of the Center Block. Fig. 7

8. Arrange 2 each of Unit 1 and Unit 2, and 1 Unit 3a above and below the Center Block. Sew units into top/bottom borders, then sew to top and bottom of Center Block to complete Center Section ( $24^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square unfinished). Fig. 8

Center Section - Make 1
9. Sew 1 each Fabric H Small Left and Right Corners to the long sides of a Fabric E Small Kite. Make a total of 4 each of Units $4 a$ and $4 b$, noting orientation of chevron stripe ( $2 \frac{5}{8}$ " square unfinished). Fig. 9

10. Cut all $5^{1 / 1 / 8 " ~ F a b r i c ~} \mathbf{F}$ and $3^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{H}$ squares in half diagonally once. Arrange 1 each Units 4a and 4b between 2 each Fabric H triangles as shown and sew together. Add a Fabric $\mathbf{F}$ triangle along the long edges of each unit. Make a total of 2 each Units 5 a and 5 b ( $4^{3} / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square unfinished). Fig. 10

11. Arrange a prepared Fabric B Large Quarter-Circle appliqué on a Fabric H $5^{1 / 21}$ square, aligning straight edges. Refer to Step 2 to complete the fusible appliqué. Make a total of 8 of Unit 6 ( $5^{1 / 2 "}$ " square unfinished). Fig. 11

12. Arrange a prepared Fabric G Small Quarter-Circle appliqué on the Fabric $\mathbf{F}$ corner of Units 5 a and 5 b, aligning the straight edges. Refer to Step 2 to complete the fusible appliqué. Make a total of 2 each Units 7 a and 7 b ( $4^{3 / 4} 4^{\text {" square unfinished). Fig. } 12}$

13. Arrange the prepared Fabric E, F, and G Small Quarter-Circle appliqués on the Fabric $\mathbf{H} 25 /{ }^{5}$ " squares, aligning the straight edges. Refer to Step 2 to complete fusible appliqué. Make a total of 8 each Fabric E/H Units 8 a and 8 b (noting orientation of Fabric E), 12 Fabric F/H Unit 8c, and 16 Fabric G/H Unit 8d ( $2 \frac{5}{8}$ " square unfinished). Fig. 13

14. Arrange 1 each Unit 4a and 8c, and 2 of Unit 8d in 2 rows as shown. Stitch into rows to make a Unit 9a, noting orientation of Fabric E (43/4" square unfinished). Repeat to make 2 each of Units 9a, 9b (using 1 each Unit 4b and 8c, and 2 Unit 8d), 10a (using 2 Unit 8a and 1 each Unit 8 c and 8 d ) and 10 ( using 2 Unit 8b, and 1 each Unit 8 c and 8 d ) - 8 units total. 15. Arrange 1 each Unit 7a and 9a, and 2 of Unit 10a in 2 rows as shown. Stitch into rows. Make a total of 2 of Block 1 ( $9^{\prime \prime}$ square unfinished).

16. Arrange 1 each Unit 7b and 9b, and 2 of Unit 10b in 2 rows as shown. Stitch into rows. Make a total of 2 of Block 2 ( 9 " square unfinished). Fig. 16

Block 2 - Make 2
17. Cut all the Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ and $\mathrm{H} 7^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares in half diagonally twice. Sew 1 each Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ and $\mathbf{H} 7^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ triangles to the Fabric B sides of a Unit 6 as shown. Make a total of 4 each Blocks $3 a$ and $3 b\left(9^{3 / 8 "} \times 9^{3 / 8 " ~} \times 13^{1 / 4} 4^{\prime \prime}\right.$ unfinished). Fig. 17

Block 3a - Make 4

18. Sew 1 each Blocks 3a and 3b to adjoining sides of each Block 1 and 2. Make a total of 2 each Top/Bottom Point Sections and Side Point Sections ( $17^{7} / 8$ " $\times 17^{7} / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 25^{1 / 4 "}$ unfinished). Fig. 18

## Quilt Top Assembly

Note: Measure the Quilt Center width and height before cutting and adding borders and adjust border measurements if necessary to match your measurements.
19. Noting the Quilt Layout diagram (page 10), stitch the Top/Bottom and Side Point Sections to the Center Section.
20. With the watercolor stripes running horizontally across the square, cut a 25 " Fabric A square in half diagonally once. With the same print orientation, cut the second 25" Fabric A square in half diagonally once in the opposite direction. Fig. 19

21. Sew a Fabric A triangle to each side of the step 19 unit, keeping the triangles oriented the same as they were cut to keep the stripes running horizontally across the quilt center. Trim to $48 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ square (if needed).
22. Stitch all the $4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric $\mathbf{H}$ strips together end-to-end. Cut 2 side borders $48^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$-long. Sew borders to right and left sides of quilt. Press toward borders. Cut 2 top/bottom borders $55^{1 / 2 "}$-long. Sew the remaining border strips to top and bottom of quilt. Press toward borders.
23. Repeat Step 22 to make and add 4 " $\times$ WOF Fabric F side borders ( $55^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ long) and top/bottom ( $62^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ long) borders to the quilt.

## Finishing

24. Sew together the $2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
25. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
26. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12 " from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
27. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
