## Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric LOF = Length of Fabric

The angled pieces of this quilt are cut using templates. Trace the Diamond, Parallelogram and Triangle templates onto template plastic, including the alignment lines and seam allowances, and cut on the outside lines.

**Optional Clearview Triangle Ruler:** Refer to ruler instructions or <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=naSU8tZ7Uqg">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=naSU8tZ7Uqg</a> for how to cut the angled pieces.

To cut Diamond, Parallelogram, and Triangle fabric pieces, first cut strips of fabric as specified below, then place the templates, right side up, on the right side of a single layer of fabric. Cut around the template.

To cut Reverse Diamond, Parallelogram, and Triangle fabric pieces, first cut strips of fabric as specified below, then place the templates, wrong side up, on the right side of a single layer of fabric. Cut around the template.

## **Cutting Stripes**


The yardage given is for striped fabric where the stripes run parallel with the selvages. Press and starch fabrics, straightening the stripes as much as possible.

Each horizontal striped zigzag across the quilt consists of one striped fabric. Use the quilt image and cutting diagrams as a guide, making sure to place the marked 'Top' edge of the Diamond/ Reversed Diamond template consistently at the same point in the strip to create a constant zigzag across the quilt. However please note when sewing, the stripes may not match perfectly, giving the quilt a beautiful human touch. For an offset zigzag, cut the LOF strips for the Reverse Diamonds with the opposite color stripe at the top edge to that of the Diamonds, or to create a unique quilt, cut the LOF strips one after another not worrying about where the stripe falls on the top edge of the Diamonds.


## Fabrics A through J, fussy cut from each:

(6) 3½" x LOF; sub-cut (24) Diamonds and (24) Reverse Diamonds (4) 4" x 5½" rectangles

### Fabrics K, M, Q and S, cut from each:

(3) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut (24) Reverse Parallelograms (1) 15%" x WOF; sub-cut

(2)  $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

#### Fabric L, cut:

(3) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut (24) Parallelograms

(1) 15/8" x WOF; sub-cut (2) 15/8" x 51/2" rectangles

(10)  $2^{1}/2$ " x WOF for binding

## Fabrics N, R and T, cut from each:

(3) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut (24) Parallelograms

(1) 1%" x WOF; sub-cut (2) 1%" x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

#### Fabric O, cut:

(3) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut (24) Reverse Parallelograms

(2) 2½" x WOF; sub-cut (24) Reverse Triangles

(1)  $2^{1}/4$ " x WOF; sub-cut

(1)  $2^{1}/4$ " x  $5^{1}/2$ " rectangle

(2)  $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

#### Fabric P, cut:

(3) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut

(24) Parallelograms

(2) 2½" x WOF; sub-cut (24) Triangles

(1)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF; sub-cut

(1)  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle

(2)  $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

#### Instructions

**Note:** Follow the **Quilt Layout** diagram on page 6 while assembling the quilt.

All seam allowances are  $\frac{1}{4}$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together.

#### Column 1

Press seam allowances towards the bottom of the column.

- 1. Sew a 4" x 5½" **Fabric B** rectangle to the bottom of a **Fabric A** rectangle along one 5½" edge. If you planned your cuts so that the same-color stripes will align across the quilt top, make sure to orient the rectangles the same as the top of the fussy-cut Diamonds.
- 2. Sew a 15/8" x 51/2" **Fabric K** rectangle to the **Fabric B** rectangle.
- 3. Continue to add pieces in the order shown in the **Quilt Layout** diagram to complete Column 1 ( $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $83\frac{1}{2}$ ").

#### Column 2

Press seam allowances towards the top of the column.


**4.** Using the same process as Column 1, sew the pieces together in the order shown in the **Quilt Layout** diagram to complete Column  $2 (5\frac{1}{2} \times 83\frac{1}{2})$ .

#### Column 3

Press seam allowances towards the top of the column.

**Tip:** When sewing the Diamonds and Parallelograms (regular or reverse) together, offset the pieces to ensure there is a V-shaped trough at the ½" seam at the beginning and end of the pieces. When sewing the Diamonds and Triangles (regular or reverse) together, the offset will only be at one end. (**Fig. 1**).

- **5.** Sew a **Fabric P** Triangle to the top of a **Fabric A** Diamond noting orientation.
- 6. Sew a Fabric B Diamond to the bottom of the Fabric A Diamond, followed by a Fabric L Parallelogram.
- 7. Continue to add Diamonds and Parallelograms in the order shown in the **Quilt Layout** and finally a **Fabric P** Triangle to complete (1) Column 3 (3½" x 83½").
- **8.** Repeat Steps 5 through 7 to make a total of (12) of Column 3.

#### Column 4

Press seam allowances towards the bottom of the column.

- Sew a Fabric O Reverse Triangle to the top of a Fabric A Reverse Diamond, noting orientation.
- 10. Sew a Fabric B Reverse Diamond to the bottom of the Fabric A Reverse Diamond, followed by a Fabric K Reverse Parallelogram.
- 11. Continue to add Reverse Diamonds and Reverse Parallelograms in the order shown in the **Quilt Layout** and finally a **Fabric O** Reverse Triangle to complete (1) Column 4 (3½" x 83½").
- **12.** Repeat Steps 9 through 11 to make a total of (12) of Column 4.

## **Quilt Top Assembly**

Press seam allowances open.


- **13.** Sew (1) Column 3 and 4 together along the length, matching the seams in the center to form a "V" to make (1) Column 3/4 pair  $(6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $83\frac{1}{2}$ "). Repeat to make (12) Column 3/4 pairs.
- **14.** Sew the Column 3/4 pairs together to complete the Quilt Center  $(72\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $83\frac{1}{2}$ ").
- **15.** Sew Column 1 to the left edge and Column 2 the right edge of the Quilt Center to complete the Quilt Top (82½" x 83½").




## Finishing

- **16.** Sew together the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric L** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
- **17.** Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
- 18. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to ½" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
- **19.** Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.

## **Quilt Layout**







This square should measure 1" x 1" (2.54cm x 2.54cm) when printed.
