


WOF = Width of Fabric

Cutting diagrams have been provided for fussy cut fabric pieces for the quilt. *These diagrams are only to be used as a guide.* Bought yardages are cut straight from the bolt and the beginning and ending points of the repeat will differ from the diagrams. There has been extra yardage allowed in the fabric requirements to ensure that all of the fussy cut pieces can be cut no matter where the print repeat begins.

Fabric A, fussy cut:

(16) 5½" squares; on point centered over a celosia bloom

Fabric B, cut:

(3) 3½" x WOF; sub-cut
(32) 3½" squares

Fabric C, cut:

(4) 3" x WOF; sub-cut
(16) 3" x 8" rectangles

Fabric D, fussy cut:

(21) 3" squares; centered over a round flower head

Fabric E, cut:

(6) 3" x WOF for Outer Border

Fabric F, cut:

(3) 3½" x WOF; sub-cut
(32) 3½" squares
(2) 3" x WOF; sub-cut
(4) 3" x 18" sashing strips
(5) 3" x WOF for Inner Border

Fabric G, cut:

(6) 2½" x WOF for Binding


Instructions

All seam allowances are ¼" and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press seam allowances following the arrows.

Half Square Triangle Units

1. Draw a line along one diagonal on the wrong side of all the 3½" **Fabric B** squares.
2. Place a 3½" **Fabric B** and **F** square right sides together, matching the edges, and pin. Sew ¼" on each side of the drawn line, cut on the drawn line, and press. Trim half square triangle (HST) units to 3" square, keeping diagonal seam centered in the corners. Repeat to make (64) HST units. (**Fig. 1**)



Unit 1

3. Sew (2) HST units together as shown in **Fig. 2**. Sew the pair of HST to the right-hand edge of a 5½" **Fabric A** square, noting the placement of the **Fabric A** print.

4. Sew (2) HST units and (1) 3" **Fabric D** square together as shown in **Fig. 3**. Sew the resulting section to the top edge of the Step 3 unit to complete (1) Unit 1 (8" square).

5. Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to make a total of (16) Unit 1.

Block

6. Lay out (4) Unit 1, (4) 3" x 8" **Fabric C** rectangles and (1) 3" **Fabric D** square into 3 rows. (**Fig. 4**) Sew the pieces into rows. Sew the rows together to complete (1) Block (18" square). Repeat to make (4) Blocks.

Quilt Top Assembly

Note: Follow the **Quilt Layout** diagram on page 5 while assembling the quilt. Press seam allowances towards sashing strips and borders.

7. Sew (1) 3" x 18" **Fabric F** sashing strip between (2) Blocks to complete (1) Block Row (18" x 38"). Repeat to make (2) Block Rows.
8. Sew (1) 3" **Fabric D** square between (2) 3" x 18" **Fabric F** sashing strips to complete (1) Sashing Row (3" x 38").
9. Sew the Sashing Row between the (2) Block Rows to complete the Quilt Center (38" square).
10. From the 3" x WOF **Fabric F** Inner Border strips, cut (2) 3" x 38" side border strips. Sew the border strips the left and right sides of the Quilt Center.
11. Sew the remaining (3) **Fabric F** Inner Border strips together, end-to-end into a long strip. Cut (2) 3" x 43" border strips. Sew the border strips to the top and bottom of the Quilt Center.
12. Sew (3) **Fabric E** Outer Border strips together, end to end. Cut (2) 3" x 43" border strips. Sew the border strips to the left and right sides of the Quilt Center.
13. Sew the remaining (3) **Fabric E** Outer Border strips together, end-to-end. Cut (2) 3" x 48" border strips. Sew the border strips to the top and bottom of the Quilt Center to complete the Quilt Top (48" square).

Finishing

14. Sew together the (6) 2½" **Fabric G** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
15. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
16. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
17. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
