## Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric
LOF = Length of Fabric

Note: Label cut pieces with fabric letter identifier for easier construction.

## Fabric A, cut:

(1) $5^{11 / 2 " 1} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(4) $5^{1 / 2 "} \times 8^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

From remaining yardage, cut:
(4) $5^{1 / 21} \times$ LOF; sub-cut
(4) $5^{1 / 2 "} \times 51^{1 / 2 "}$ borders
(5) $2^{1 / 2 "} \times$ LOF for binding

## Fabric B, cut:

(8) $2^{1 / 21} \times$ WOF for outer borders
(19) $1 \frac{1}{1 / 2} \times$ WOF; set aside 9 for long sashing strips, and sub-cut remaining strips into:
(2) $1^{1 / 2 "} \times 27^{1 / 2 "}$ sashing strips
(4) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 14^{1 / 2}$ " sashing strips
(12) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{1 / 2 "}$ rectangles
(12) $1^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{1 / 2 "}$ " rectangles

## Fabric C, cut:

(1) $271 / 2$ " square

Fabric D, cut:
(2) $11^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(4) $11^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares

## Fabric E, cut:

(1) $11 / \frac{1}{2} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(4) $11^{1 / 2 "} \times 6^{1 / 2 "}$ " rectangles

## Fabric F, cut:

(1) $11^{1} / 22^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(4) $11^{11 / 2 " ~} \times 5^{1} 1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

## Fabric G, cut:

(2) $5^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(8) $5^{1 / 21}$ " squares

Fabric H, cut:
(1) $8^{1 / 2 " 1} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(4) $8^{1 / 21} \times 5^{112} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

## Fabric I, cut:

(1) $5^{11 / 2 " ~} \times$ WOF; sub-cut
(4) $5^{1 / 2 "}$ " squares

## Sewing

All seam allowances are $1 / 4$ " and pieces are sewn right sides together. Press seam allowances toward the Fabric B rectangles and sashing unless otherwise indicated.

1. Sew a $1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 27^{1} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $B$ sashing to the left and right sides of the Fabric $\mathbf{C}$ center square. Press.
2. Arrange (1) each Fabric $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{H}$ rectangle, (1) each Fabric I and G square, (2) $1^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ $5^{1 / 2 "}$ " Fabric B rectangles, and (1) $1^{1 / 2 "} \times 14^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric B sashing in three rows as shown (Fig. 1 shown top right). Sew the rectangles and squares in the top and bottom rows together along adjacent edges. Press. Sew the top and bottom rows toward the center sashing row. Press. Make 4 units.

3. Sew (1) $1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ rectangle to the long right-hand side of a Fabric $\mathbf{F}$ rectangle. Press. Repeat to sew a second $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 11^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric B rectangle to the right-hand side of a Fabric E rectangle. Arrange the F and E units as shown (Fig. 2) and sew them together along adjacent edges. Press. Make 4 units.

4. Arrange (1) step 2 unit and (1) step 3 unit as shown (Fig. 3). Sew the units together along adjacent edges. Press. Make a total of (4) joined units.

## Top Assembly

Refer to the Quilt Layout Diagram on page 5 for sashing placement and unit orientation while completing the quilt top.
5. Noting orientation, sew (1) joined unit from step 4 to the left and right sashed sides of the Fabric Center square to make the center row. Press.
6. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{1} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ rectangle to one edge of a Fabric $D$ square. Press. Make (4) sashed squares.
7. Referring to the Quilt Layout Diagram for orientation, sew (1) Fabric $D$ sashed square to each end of the two remaining step 4 joined units, making sure the Fabric D squares are on the outer ends of the pieced rows. Press.
8. Join the (9) remaining $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ strips end-to-end. Press. From the joined strips, cut (2) $1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 63^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and (4) $1^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 51^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sashing strips.
9. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{1} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 51^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ sashing strip to the bottom edge of one step 7 pieced row. Sew a second $1 \frac{1}{1} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 51 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B sashing strip to the top edge of the other pieced row. Press. Noting orientation, sew the sashed rows to the top and bottom edges of the center row. Press.
10. Sew one of the remaining $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 51^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric $\mathbf{B}$ sashing strips to the long edge of a $5^{1} / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 51^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A border. Repeat to make a second pieced border. With the Fabric A borders toward the outside, sew one pieced border to the left side and the other to the right side of the quilt center. Press.
11. Sew (1) $1^{11 / 2 "} \times 5^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangle to one side of a Fabric G square. Press. Make 4 B/G units. Sew (1) $B / G$ unit to each end of the two remaining $5^{1 ⁄ 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 51^{1} 1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A borders. Press. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{1} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 63^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B sashing to one edge of each pieced border. Press. With the Fabric B sashing strips toward the center, sew one pieced border to the top, and the other to the bottom edge of the quilt center. Press.
12. Join pairs of the $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric $B$ outer border strips end-to-end. Press. From the (4) joined pairs, cut (2) $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 67^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top/bottom outer borders, and (2) $2^{1} 12^{\prime \prime} \times 63^{1} 1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ side outer borders. Sew one side border to each side of the quilt center. Press. Sew one top/bottom border to the top edge and the other to the bottom edge of the quilt center to complete the quilt top. Press.

## Finishing

13. Sew together the (5) $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF Fabric A binding strips end-to-end. using diagonal seams. Press the seams open. Press the binding strip in half wrong sides together.
14. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top after quilting is completed.
15. Leaving an 8 " $(20.32 \mathrm{~cm})$ tail of binding, sew binding to top of quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12 " $(30.48 \mathrm{~cm})$ from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where these two loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding together right sides together. Trim seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}(.64 \mathrm{~cm})$ and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
16. Turn the binding to the back of the quilt and hand stitch in place.
